## Seeing Self in Community

Tuesday April 23, 2012. <u>11:00 – 2:00PM</u>

<u>Description</u>: Attendees will collaboratively present community alphabets worked on from the previous workshop. Using ideas taken from the exercise, participants will combine images with their own definitions of community. The distilling of their community alphabets will be the beginning of learning how to "Look to See". Using the idea of looking to see, participants will create self-portrait drawings that will be centerpieces of personal installations about collaborating in community.

Learn a way to create personal portraits, by looking to see</li> <li>D.) Practice Mindfulness – which is the practice of peace</li> </ul>

	G.) Show an object briefly, and then hide the object so that participants		
	draw from memory		5 minutes
	H.) Bring object back from hiding and discuss what was included and not

	I.) Repeat steps B and C with increasingly more detailed or complex		
	objects two more times		20 minutes
	J.) Using an 8" X 10" image, draw a portrait	using acetate	
	K.) Final Reflections		15 minutes
